

TO ISSUE BONDS FOR BUILDING

Bethel-Township-School-Board Finds Way Out Of Their Dilemma.

The board of education of Bethel township last night decided to issue \$3,000 worth of bonds, the same to be used towards the erection of the new high school building at Olive Branch.

The law gives the board the right to issue as much as a 2 mill levy without first submitting it to a vote of the people. Suit is pending to enjoin the board from erecting the proposed building and Judge Kunkle issued a temporary restraining order, preventing the board from entering into a contract for the construction of the same until the auditor or the clerk of the township certifies to him that the money is in the fund or is in the course of collection.

Bids were received last Friday for the construction of the building. The lowest one was \$12,000 and the highest \$13,500. With the money derived from ~~the sale of bonds~~ the board members claim they will have sufficient funds to pay for it. As soon as the bond sale is advertised a motion will be filed by the board asking that the injunction be dissolved.
