

BETHEL TOWNSHIP SCHOOLHOUSE CASE AGAIN

Motion to Dissolve Injunction Was Argued

Claim Board Has Plenty of Cash to Erect Building

The motion of the defendants in the case of Samuel Detrich and others against the board of education, to dissolve the temporary injunction prohibiting the board from the erection of a new high school building in Bethel township, was heard on arguments in common pleas court this morning. Zimmerman and Witmeyer represented the plaintiffs and Lawrence E. Laybourne the defendants.

The plaintiff's attorneys are opposed to dissolving the injunction, contending that the board of education has not sufficient money on hand to enter into a contract for the erection of the new building, while on the other hand Laybourne claims that since the sale of recent bonds there is a total of \$12,000 at hand sufficient for all needs and with enough left over to erect the building.

The court requested that briefs be submitted, after which he will decide the case at once.
